French Polynesia (French: Polynésie française, Tahitian: Porinetia Farani) is a French "overseas collectivity" (French: collectivité d'outre mer, or COM) with the particular designation of "overseas country" (French: pays d'outre-mer, or POM) in the southern Pacific Ocean. The country is made up of several groups of Polynesian islands.

The capital, Papeete, is on Tahiti, French Polynesia's largest island (403 square miles [1,043 square km]), in the Society group. French Polynesia in Tahitian is Polynésie Farani.

Papeete, located on Tahiti, is the capital of French Polynesia. Although not an integral part of its territory, Clipperton Island was administered from French Polynesia until 2007.
