

# Italy energy storage europe

What is the EU state aid scheme for energy storage in Italy?

The European Union (EU) Commission has approved a state aid scheme aiming to fund the rollout of over 9GW/71GWh of energy storage in Italy. The scheme totalling EUR17.7 billion (US\$19.5 billion) will provide annual payments covering investment and operating costs for those developing, building and operating large-scale energy storage in Italy.

Does Italy need electricity storage?

As Italy's energy mix is increasingly composed of variable renewable energy sources, electricity storage will be needed to integrate power generated by renewables into the national grid and make it available when sun and wind energy are not accessible.

Are battery energy storage systems needed in Italy?

Therefore, battery energy storage systems (BESS) are needed in Italy. The Italian market for BESS is growing rapidly and currently amounts to 2.3 GW but it almost exclusively consists of residential scale systems, associated with small scale solar plants, having a capacity of less than 20 kWh.

Does Italy need 9gw/71gwh of energy storage?

Are energy storage systems becoming more popular in Italy?

Terna, the Italian TSO who monitors energy storage installation trends in Italy, has recently confirmed this growing demand for storage systems. Terna have published statistics relating to the type and frequency of storage systems being constructed.

How will Italy develop utility-scale electricity storage facilities?

To develop utility-scale electricity storage facilities, the Italian Government set up a scheme that was approved by the European Commission at the end of 2023. Italy will promote investments in utility scale electricity storage to reach at least 70 GWh, and worth over Euro 17 bn, in the next ten years.

In December 2023, the EU greenlit Italy's energy storage program, earmarking a hefty investment of EUR17.7 billion. This initiative is anticipated to facilitate the construction of over 9GW/71GWh of energy storage systems (ESS).

The grid-scale energy storage market in Italy is set to become one of the most active in Europe in the next few years having been close to non-existent until now. Research firm LCP Delta recently forecast that after annual

grid-scale deployments of just 20MW in the last few years, Italy would deploy 800-900MW in 2023/2024, second in scale only ...

According to data released last week by Italian solar energy association Italia Solare, Italy's independent energy storage installations surged in the first half of 2024, with a connected capacity of approximately 650MW, almost 10 times that of the same period in 2023.

Excessive inventory posed a significant challenge for the European residential battery storage market in 2023. According to EESA statistics, new installations in Europe's residential battery storage sector amounted to 5.1GWh in the first half of 2023, indicating that the 5.2GWh inventory accumulated by the end of 2022 had been depleted.

The energy storage market in Italy doubled in capacity in the first half of the year, though Q2 saw the first slowdown in nine quarters and that could be repeated in H2, according to the country's renewable energy trade body.

Italy's installed energy storage capacity in 2023 is 3.9 GW, and is expected to increase to 18 GW by 2030, mainly in the pre-table energy storage and household storage markets. The capacity market and MACSE energy storage procurement mechanism have promoted the development of pre-table energy storage, and more than 2 GW of battery energy ...

Italy's grid-scale energy storage market is set to be one of Europe's busiest this year, with some 2.6GW/8.9GWh set to come online according to LCP Delta. Large-scale BESS are set to capitalise on significant opportunities in the capacity market, ancillary services and renewable load shifting .

As of 31 March 2022, most Italian energy storage facilities have been built in connection with small-scale solar power plants, while medium to large-scale storage systems are less commonplace. Storage systems combined with thermoelectric power plants, fuel cells and wind power plants are still very rare.
