Are zinc-bromine flow batteries economically viable?

Zinc-bromine flow batteries have shown promise in their long cycle life with minimal capacity fade, but no single battery type has met all the requirements for successful ESS implementation. Achieving a balance between the cost, lifetime and performance of ESSs can make them economically viable for different applications.

Zinc-bromine rechargeable batteries are a promising candidate for stationary energy storage applications due to their non-flammable electrolyte, high cycle life, high energy density and low material cost. Different structures of ZBRBs have been proposed and developed over time, from static (non-flow) to flowing electrolytes.

What are the different types of zinc-bromine batteries?

Zinc-bromine batteries can be split into two groups: flow batteries and non-flow batteries. Primus Power (US) is active in commercializing flow batteries, while Gelion (Australia) and EOS Energy Enterprises (US) are developing and commercializing non-flow systems. What is a non-flow electrolyte in a zinc-bromine battery?

In the early stage of zinc-bromine batteries, electrodes were immersed in a non-flowing solution of zinc-bromide that was developed as a flowing electrolyte over time.
