State-owned National Gas Company is responsible for the purchase, sale, transmission, distribution, and aggregation of Trinidad and Tobago's natural gas resources. POWERGEN (Power Generation Company of Trinidad and Tobago) is the leading independent power producer in the country.

The MEEI (Ministry of Energy and Energy Industries) manages Trinidad and Tobago's oil, gas, and mineral resources. The MEEI is responsible for monitoring, controlling, and regulating the country's energy and mineral sectors. The Regulated Industries Commission also serves as a regulator for the energy sector.
